According to reports elsewhere an app of increasing popularity with young people is 'Twitch'. Twitch is a live streaming site and most of the students who say they use Twitch are simply watching streams, whilst a smaller number are going live themselves. A fundamental rule of e-safety to remember: offenders will be where the children are. It is therefore important we educate children to have the correct privacy settings and ensure if they do stream online they know who can see it. This is a message we deliver as an Academy and advise parents and carers to reinforce at home.
