Change to the school day at Priory Belvoir Academy

As you may be aware from the national media, the government now expects all schools to operate a 32.5-hour week from the academic year 2023-2024. The Department for Education (DfE) will measure these hours simply through a school's start and finish times.

As a result, and in order to comply with this new requirement, we need to make a minor adjustment to the school day at the Priory Belvoir Academy.

From the start of the new academic year in August 2023, our school day <u>for all age groups</u> will be as follows:

Start time: 8.40am **Finish time:** 3.10pm This will ensure that all pupils are in school for the required 6.5 hours per day.

We have made the decision to start the school day 5 minutes earlier at 8.40am and have used this opportunity to extend the tutorial session to 25 minutes to more easily facilitate assemblies and tutorial and PSHE based learning activities. The rest of the school day will move forward by 5 minutes and therefore the end of the day will finish five minutes later at 3.10pm.
